- 🐾 **Adoption:** We have hundreds of animals in our shelter just waiting for a great family to adopt them!
- 🐾 **Volunteering:** Looking to help the animals? Come spend your extra time playing, walking, and interacting with our animals!
- 🐾 **Fostering:** Not able to adopt, but you can take an animal into your home short-term? Call us and ask about fostering, a great program that saves hundreds of lives every year!
- 🐾 **Officer dispatch:** Call our shelter to have an officer pick up a stray animal or investigate an animal related issue!
- 🐾 **Licensing:** Keep your animal safe and legal with a license!
- 🐾 **Microchips and Vaccinations:** Low-cost vaccinations and microchips are available for walk-in service. Call 801-559-1100 for more information.

Pet owners are required to know and understand the animal control ordinances. Carefully check and follow all regulations.

Be sure that you clearly understand where off leash park boundaries are located. It is always important to follow all posted rules. When taking your dogs to and off-leash park, always keep leashes on until you are within the off leash boundaries.

All parks are patrolled and ordinance violations are enforced.

Off-Leash Parks

Salt Lake County regulations require dogs to be leashed in almost all public areas.

For those interested in allowing dogs to roam without a leash, there are certain Salt Lake Valley areas that have been designated “off-leash” areas. These parks and recreation areas are places where your dog(s) can safely (and legally) play without a leash! Just keep in mind some **simple rules for any off-leash parks:**

- 🐾 Dogs must be under voice command. Do not bring more dogs than you can safely control.
- 🐾 Leash dogs showing aggression.
- 🐾 Dogs must be vaccinated, licensed, and wear identification.
- 🐾 Always clean up after your dog.
- 🐾 Never leave your dog unattended and keep them within sight at all times.

Lindsey Gardens, about 1.5 acres, 7th Avenue and ‘O’ Street
North East corner of park

Freedom Trail, one mile, 375 North 130 East Canyon Rd. (The Memory Grove area is NOT off-leash)

Herman Franks Park, about one acre fenced, 700 E. 1300 S.

Jordan Park, about ½ acre, 900 S. 900 W.
Small fenced area, North side

Parley’s Historic Nature Park, 88 acres, 2700 E. 2700 S.

Mill Creek Canyon, 14-mile round trip, dogs allowed off-leash only on **ODD**-numbered days. Must be leashed until on trail, 3800 East 3900 South.

Sandy Dog Park, about one acre fenced, 300 E. 9980 S.

Millrace Dog Park, about 1.75 acres fenced, 1150 W 5400 S. Tag required (call 801-965-5800 for more information)

Visiting an On-Leash Park?

- 🐾 **Always keep your dog leashed!** Remember, dogs off leash can be injured or injure others!
- 🐾 **Cleaning up after your dog is important!** In order to keep parks and public areas open to dogs, it is necessary to keep areas clean!
- 🐾 **Proper identification** is always important. It could save your animal’s life.
- 🐾 **Always be respectful of other park users.**
